Addinity Suggestions

This tune will be a fun and active way to start off your day. During the chorus of nah-nah's, wave your hand or hands back and forth over your head. Following are the movements for each line of the verse. We re lookin, for some fun today - Make binoculars out of your hands and put them over your eves. Anvtime we work or play - Roll your hands and arms. It can be here or there, or anywhere that we "re together - Point down, point straight ahead, point five times moving from left to right. It only takes me and you - Point to yourself then someone else. It doesn "t matter what we do - Extend your hands in front of you (palmsdown) and cross them over

each other. We can create the fun by using our imagnations to move us - Make fists and alternate tapping them on top of each other, then point to your brain, and then extend one fist and arm into the air. Encourage the children to join the kids on the CD in asking When, Where, Who, What & Why.

Climb on aboard as we chug to the library, the lunchroom, the playground, or wherever it is that your destination might be. The first verse of the song is the preparation phase in which the children form a single file line, with their hands on the shoulders of the person in front of them. This will give them room to move their arms and their bodies when the train gets rolling. During the chorus, put your arm straight up in the air and pull down to simulate pulling the rope or chain to blow the whistle. When the second verse begins have the kids hold their arms at a ninety-degree angle with their forearms and hands horizontal to the floor. They should alternate moving them backwards and forwards while swaving the upper body back and forth. The rest is up to you so; Go choo-choo to your destination!

Additing Suggestions

If your kids have caught a case of the boogie-woogies, then I have the cure. Start this song sitting down with the kids trying to remain as still as

possible. When they hear the words, Shake it up let them explode from their seats and shake and dance. When the chorus is over, have them sit once again and listen for the next verse.
